

STILL MISSING PIECES: ENERGY PERMITTING REFORM



ENR

- Previously led Senate permitting, advancing bipartisan EPRA in 2024
- Will ENR keep EPRA largely intact, or will they seek to carve their own path to speed up enviro reviews?
- Expect transmission to be key to achieving bipartisan support.



EPW

- Negotiations between EPW and HNR ultimately stalled before the conclusion of the 118th Congress.
- While the SPEED Act received 11
 Democratic votes in the House on
 Dec. 18, it faces stiff opposition
 from Sens. Whitehouse, Heinrich,
 and Schatz; without them,
 consensus will be difficult to
 achieve Senate-side.



HOUSE BILLS: PUTTING THE PIECES TOGETHER

Standardizing Permitting and Expediting Economic Development (SPEED) Act

Key concept: Streamlines infrastructure permitting by reforming NEPA.

- Narrows NEPA reviews to project-level impacts rather than up- or downstream enviro effects
- Expands agencies' abilities to use categorical exclusions and other streamlined review processes
- Imposes new deadlines on agency reviews and limits scope/timing for judicial action

Status: Passed the House on 12/18/25 with a 221-196 vote. 11 Ds and one R voted against party lines.

Fair Allocation of Interstate Rates (FAIR) Act

Key concept: Amends the Federal Power Act to prohibit cost allocation of policy-driven transmission to consumers in states that did not approve or benefit from the underlying policy.

• Requires FERC to issue implementing regulations within six months

Status: Introduced to House E&C on 12/01/25.

Promoting Efficient Review for Modern Infrastructure Today Act (PERMIT) Act

Key Concept: Limits states' authority under Clean Water Act to block infrastructure projects.

- Tightens permit review windows and allows CWA permits to last up to 10 years instead of five
- Reduces EPA's ability to revoke/veto previously approved permits under CWA

Status: Passed the House on 12/11/25 by a 221-205 vote. Six Ds and one R voted against party lines.

ePermit Act

Key Concept: Modernizes environmental reviews and authorizations through the use of interactive, digital, and cloud-based platforms.

Status: Passed the House unanimously on 12/10/25.

Reducing and Eliminating Duplicative Environmental Regulations (RED Tape) Act

Key Concept: Amends the Clean Air Act to eliminate the EPA's requirement to review and comment on federal construction projects that are already subject to environmental review under NEPA.

Status: Passed the House E&C Subcommittee on 12/10/25 by a 12-10 votes along party lines.

2026 SENATE OUTLOOK

While some of the House bills may be sent to the Senate, lawmakers may choose to revise them, incorporate parts into a broader package, or scrap them all together.

It remains to be seen how heavily **Senate ENR** leans on the Energy Permitting Reform Act (EPRA), which failed to advance at the end of last Congress. Chairman Lee (R-UT) has expressed optimism on the prospect of a permitting package on the Senate floor next year.

senate EPW will also need to contribute to a permitting reform package. Reason for optimism: both Chairwoman Capito and Ranking Member Whitehouse have expressed support for reaching a deal under certain conditions.
